Sunday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem (Matt. 21:1-11; Luke 19:28-44; Mark 11:1-10; Luke 19:28-40; John 12:12-18)</li> <li>• Jesus surveys the temple area (Mark 11:11)</li> <li>• Return to Bethany (Matt. 21:17; Mark 11:11)</li> </ul>
Monday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cursing the fig tree on the way to Jerusalem (Matt. 21:18-22; cf. Mark 11:12-14)</li> <li>• Clearing the temple (Matt. 21:12-13; Mark 11:15-17)</li> <li>• Miracles and challenges in the temple (Matt. 21:14-16; Mark 1:18)</li> <li>• Return to Bethany (Mark 11:19)</li> </ul>
Tuesday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reaction to cursing the fig tree on the way back up to Jerusalem (Matt. 21:20-22; Mark 11:20-21)</li> <li>• Debates with religious leaders in Jerusalem and teaching in the temple (Matt. 21:23-23:39; Mark 11:27-12:44; Luke 20:1-8)</li> <li>• Eschatological Discourse on the Mount of Olives on the return to Bethany (Matt. 24:1-25:46; Mark 13:1-37)</li> </ul>
Wednesday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• "Silent Wednesday" – Jesus and disciples remain in Bethany for last time of fellowship</li> <li>• Judas returns alone to Jerusalem to make arrangements for the betrayal (Matt. 26:14-16; Mark 14:10-11)</li> </ul>
Thursday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Preparations for Passover (Matt. 26:17-19; Mark 14:12-16)</li> <li><i>After sundown:</i></li> <li>• Passover meal and Last Supper (Matt. 26:20-35; Mark 14:17-26)</li> <li>• Upper Room discourses (John 13-17)</li> <li>• Prayers in the Garden of Gethsemane (Matt. 26:36-46; Mark 14:32-42)</li> </ul>
Friday	<p><i>Sometime perhaps after midnight</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Betrayal and arrest (Matt. 26:47-56; Mark 14:43-52)</li> <li>• Jewish trial- Jesus appears in three phases in front of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Anna (John 18:13-24)</li> <li>- Caiaphas and partial Sanhedrin (Matt. 26:57-75; Mark 14:53-65)</li> <li>- Sanhedrin fully assembled (<i>perhaps after sunrise</i>) (Matt. 27:1-2; Mark 15:1)</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Roman trial – Jesus appears in three phases before: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Pilate (Matt. 27:2-14; Mark 15:2-5)</li> <li>- Herod Antipas (Luke 23:6-12)</li> <li>- Pilate (Matt. 27:15-26; Mark 15:6-15)</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Crucifixion (<i>approx. 9:00 A.M to 3:00 P.M</i>) (Matt. 27:27-66; Mark 15:16-39)</li> </ul>
Sunday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Resurrection witnesses (Matt. 28:1-8; Mark 16:1-8; Luke 24:1-12)</li> <li>• Resurrection appearances (Matt. 28:9-20); Luke 24:13-53; John 20-21)</li> </ul>
